RICHARD LANDSMAN COLLECTION

INTRODUCTION:

Mr. Landsman bought his home at 8 Bayview Ave. (Port Washington) in 1988. The house was built in 1863. The items in this collection were found in a third ceiling above one of the bedrooms during renovation.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

The collection contains a Fire Department Record Book which was probably kept by Henry Birkel, who lived at 8 Bayview Ave. from 1906-1914, and belonged to Protection Engine Company. Miscellaneous items include cards sent to the McLaughlin (MacLaughlin) family, a tintype of a young woman and a portrait of a young boy (both unidentified), and a Valentine's Day greeting.

ORGANIZATION:

The collection is arranged into two series:

Series I: Fire Department Record Book, Protection Engine Company, Port Washington, NY [1891-1897] (1 volume)

Records "Collection of Fines and Dues", "State of Finances", "Roll Call", "List of Expelled Members", "List of Resinged [sic] Members", "Honary [sic] Members", "Furniture and Equipments of Co.", "Caps, Badges & Belts"

Series II: Miscellaneous Items [1935-1936 and undated] (1 folder)

Items include cards sent to the McLaughlin (MacLaughlin) family, a tintype of a woman and a portrait of a young boy (both unidentified).
