## MASON-MALONE PHOTOGRAPHS

### **INTRODUCTION:**

The Mason Studio in Port Washington, New York was a photo studio owned by Stanley Gerard Mason. The images in this collection were part of the Mason Studio's archive of prints and negatives. They were acquired by Hugh Malone who made copy negatives which he donated to the library. Copy prints were made from each negative.

### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

These images of Port Washington date from approximately the 1881 to 1971. Among the photographs are historical scenes of the town as depicted in postcards, local residents, the town's fire departments, school sports teams and class photos, and images of the waterfront. Laura Cocks, the Seaman family, Dorothy Ford, W. Berkel, and Mrs. Philpott are among the individuals and families represented.

### **ORGANIZATION:**

The collection is arranged in numerical order. Each image has a number, but there is no alphabetical or subject arrangement. A complete list of images is available in the Local History Center.
