PORT WASHINGTON NORTH COLLECTION

INTRODUCTION:

Port Washington North was incorporated as a village in 1932. The petition, written at that time, described the area as: “consisting of the Mill Pond and surrounding homes, the Cocks and Crescent Sand properties, and part of the area popularly known as ‘Hicksville’ – Valley Road and a sliver of land bounded by Avenues B and C...” Jacob Cocks was elected the first mayor on August 2, 1932.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

The Port Washington North Collection includes correspondence, clippings, ephemera and photographs. Most of the material is related to the 1982 celebration of Port North’s 50th Anniversary. Anniversary material includes invitations, program information and photographs of events. The collection also includes photographs of Port Washington North officials (ca. 1970-1980), historic buildings and local village town halls (ca. 1982).
