## WILLIAM C. ZWERLEIN PAPERS

### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:**

William (Bill) C. Zwerlein was born in Port Washington on January 10, 1919. A life-long resident of Port Washington, Zwerlein served in the Navy during World War II. He worked as a millwright, steam fitter and heating service mechanic, including some years with the Lewis Oil Company. In 1955 he and his brother Zeke opened a Tastee Freez on Shore Road, a business which they operated for 15 years. Bill Zwerlein began his career as a volunteer firefighter with Protection Engine Company No. 1 of the Port Washington Fire Department in 1946 and continued to serve for 63 years.

Bill Zwerlein and Ruth Sustman (1922-2007) met at the Mineola Skating Rink and were married on August 22, 1941. Bill was an avid skater who at the age of 19 started the Port Rollers skating club, with meetings held at his father's automotive repair garage. After the club dissolved, Bill and some of the other members joined the Silver Streaks club at the Mineola Skating Rink. The Zwerleins had three sons, William G., Peter J., and Robert L. Zwerlein who was killed in Vietnam in 1967 while serving aboard the *USS Forrestal*. Sons Peter and William G. both served as Chiefs of the Port Washington Fire Department. William Zwerlein died on August 1, 2009.

### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

The William Zwerlein Papers include post cards, photographs, and newsletters and memorabilia from the Mineola Skating Rink. Zwerlein's interest in Port's history is evident in his extensive collection of post cards which document the changing views of Port Washington during the early years of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The collection also includes 24 post cards (ca. 1907-1909) which were sent as greeting cards for various holidays. Most of the cards are addressed to Miss Viola van Pelt of Port Washington.

Material relating to the Mineola Skating Rink includes issues of the rink's newsletter: *Bumps & Falls*, a 1935 photograph of Silver Streaks club members, and a 1939 list of club members. Zwerlein was a frequent contributor to *Bumps & Falls*, writing under the byline "Cow Bay Pirate".
